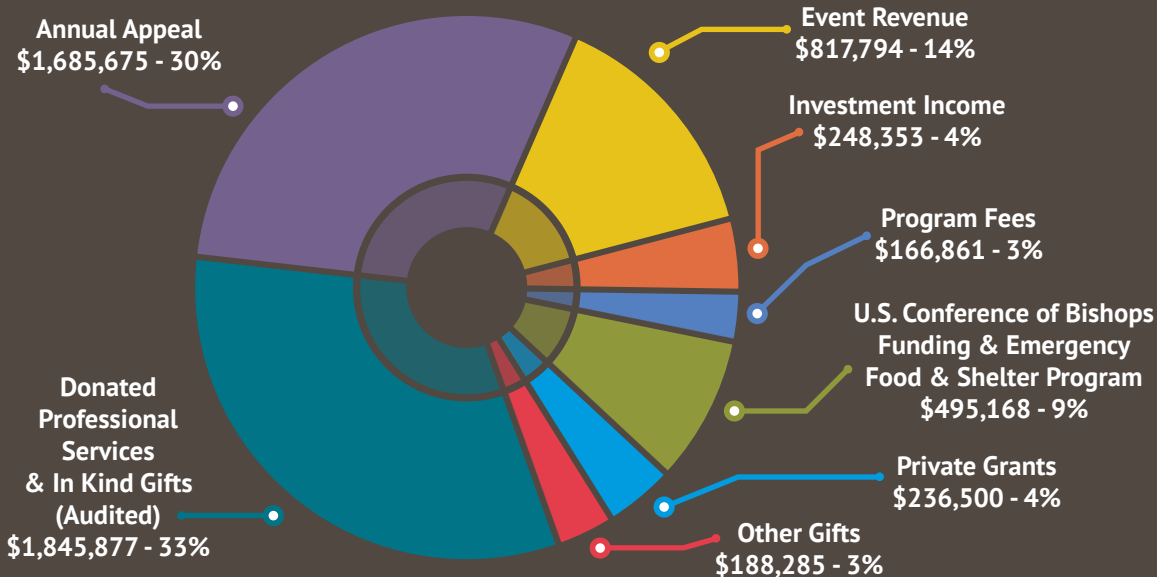
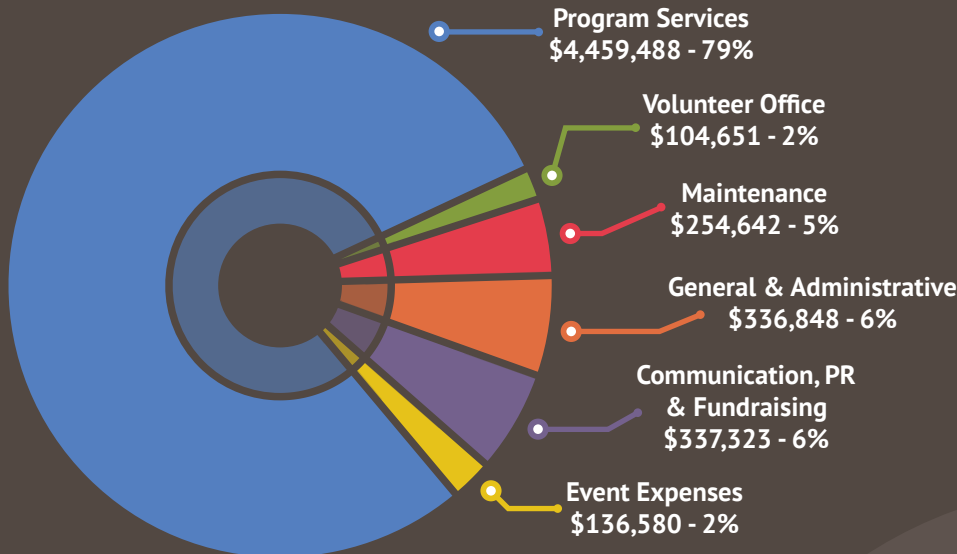


2013 Revenue - \$5.68 million

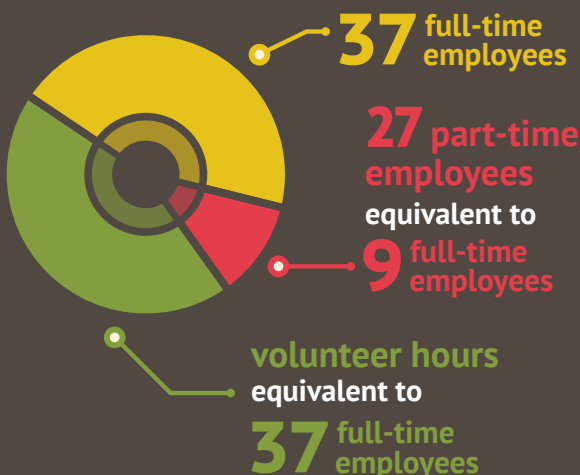
