A year after thousands of Afghan refugees arrived in the United States, their path to legal residency begins with asylum or special immigrant visas.

In Tulsa, the asylum process is being managed by a team of 69 pro bono attorneys, managed by Catholic Charities' Kojo Asamoa-Caesar. As of late October, more than 1,500 hours have been donated to the effort to help more than 200 Afghan families who are beginning to travel to Fort Smith, Arkansas, for asylum interviews.



As a former high school teacher, Emily Kamp is no stranger to a classroom. For the past 13 years, Emily has helped welcome refugees from the Congo, Russia, Iraq, Iran, Eritrea, Burma, Syria, and Afghanistan.

Her primary role teaching Cultural Orientation classes, a requirement for any refugees coming to Eastern Oklahoma, has prepared countless new Tulsans for life in the United States. In the series of seven classes, refugees learn everything from American currency and banking, grocery shopping, local laws, transportation and more.

When Catholic Charities agreed to accept 800 refugees from Afghanistan into Eastern Oklahoma in a five month period, Emily was an integral part of the team that created the framework for the Afghan refugee program and took a leadership role in the Cultural Orientation program. She contributed valuable input to help with airport greetings, case management, transportation, housing, medical assistance, interpretation, safety checks, and appropriate meals for our new "Afghan friends," as she always calls them. From August to December 2021, she gave 734 hours of her time to "welcome the stranger".


