After struggling with lupus and kidney disease for 18 years, Suprena found herself in need of a kidney transplant. She had done everything possible to get on the kidney transplant donor list, including losing 80 pounds, but her doctors told her that unless she had extensive dental work, there was no way she would get on the list for a life-saving kidney transplant. She was already working two jobs to make ends meet for all her other medical and life expenses and paying for dental work was out of the question. 
