NOURISHING THE COMMUNITY.

Statistics reveal that 15.4% of Oklahomans experience food insecurity, impacting not only their physical well-being but also their overall quality of life.

- Hunger imposes an annual economic burden of over \$1.4 billion on Oklahoma due to higher rates of illness and reduced academic performance
- Food insecurity worsens chronic health conditions such as kidney disease, high blood pressure, diabetes, and obesity, and it affects the stability of employment and income for families
- Children who face food insecurity tend to have poorer reading and math scores, face more behavioral and social challenges, and are less likely to graduate from high school

STRENGTHENING HEALTH & FAMILY.

Catholic Charities Transitional Living programs, Madonna House and St. Elizabeth Lodge, provide a stable home for women and their children while they learn skills to stabilize their families.

Our **Dental Care** and **Maternity Care** clinics are providing vital healthcare services to those who do not have other access to care.



Seeking to build a better life for herself and her young son, Erica applied to LPN school and was accepted, but needed a place to live. She knew St. Elizabeth Lodge at Catholic Charities required residents to work in order to be a part of the program, but attending both work and school would leave her little time to be with her son. Thankfully, she was allowed to attend school full time while living at St. Liz. Erica is now working as an LPN and she and her son are thriving!

SUPPORTING OUR NEIGHBORS IN NEED.

Catholic Charities provides compassionate support to people in need, offering financial assistance for rent and utility bills through Emergency Assistance, housing and care for those in their final days at Porta Caeli House, and healing retreats for individuals facing the long-term effects of abuse or abortion through our Healing Ministries. Through a wide range of programs, Catholic Charities ensures that those in crisis receive the help and dignity they deserve, fostering hope and stability in the most challenging times.



Eric had never heard of a hospice house before his mother's health began to fail. Hesitant at first, he visited Porta

Caeli House on a friend's recommendation. As soon as he entered, he was struck by the warmth and kindness of the staff, which brought him a sense of peace after weeks of stress.

Just three days later, Eric received the call that there was a spot for his mother, and she was moved in immediately. When his mother expressed how comfortable she felt, far more than in her own home, Eric's burden lifted.

The house felt welcoming, with families supporting each other and volunteers offering compassionate care. It wasn't clinical or cold; it was a place of dignity and love. When his mother passed peacefully that Sunday, Eric found comfort knowing she had been in such a serene and caring environment. Porta Caeli House truly lived up to its name—a gate of heaven for her final journey.

Opportunity abounds in America, but education and training often present barriers. Adult Education and Workforce Development provides families with the education and training needed to secure gainful employment and a steady income.

REUNITING FAMILIES.

In cooperation with the U.S. Department of Justice, our Immigration Legal Services program guides immigrants through the legal pathway to secure visas and citizenship.

Our Refugee Resettlement program coordinates the reception and transitional needs of refugees resettled by the U.S. State Department for their first 90 days after arrival.



A Burmese family has reunited in Tulsa after 15 years apart.

Brothers Dal and Thawn Khup remained in Burma when their family fled to Malaysia

in 2009 and were then resettled in the United States in 2016. With the help of Catholic Charities Refugee Resettlement program, the brothers arrived in Tulsa in June and the family is excited to start a new life after such a long time apart.


