On-Campus Services for Pregnant Women Expanding

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Tulsa opened a new pregnancy services' program named Blessed Mother Teresa Women's Health Services on January 6, 2011. The program is a cooperative relationship between Catholic Charities and the Oklahoma State University Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology. It is available to women who are pregnant or may be pregnant and are in need of medical services, which include pregnancy testing, prenatal care, and perinatal care. Initially, patients were only seen on Thursdays. As of July 1st, the program began serving patients on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm. Walk-in patients are always welcome, but appointments may be scheduled.

So far this year, Blessed Mother Teresa Women's Health Services has served more than 125 women. They are cared for by attending physicians Joseph R. Johnson, D.O., James H. Beeson, M.D.\Ph.D., Lance Frye, M.D., and Williams Po, M.D., Michelle McElroy, D.O., Lori Gore-Green, D.O., medical professional staff and Catholic Charities staff and volunteers. Pregnant women will have seven prenatal office visits at the Catholic Charities location, plus one or more visits after the baby is born. Deliveries take place at OSU Medical Center or Saint Francis Hospital.

Patients are also offered wrap-around services from Catholic Charities as needed. These services may include counseling, education programs, food, clothing, translation and other services designed to promote physical, mental, spiritual, and emotional well-being. A new pregnancy education and support group will focus on such topics as healthy relationships, depression, nutrition, parenting, NFP, car seat training and other health related issues. Kim Kirksey, MSW, and other Catholic Charities staff are coordinating this group that meets every Thursday for both English- and Spanish-speaking clients.

In addition to obstetric services, the Catholic Charities' newly-named Blessed Mother Teresa Health Center houses the Blessed Mother Teresa Dental Services program established in early 2010.


