Teaching. Our Way to Love

Every week, more than 114 students receive free classes at Catholic Charities' St. Katharine Drexel Education Center. However, the most important lesson taught at the center is not in the books.

Each year, more than 350 students receive GED, ESL, computer, NFP, job hunting, literacy and parenting classes at Catholic Charities. More than 25 volunteer teachers and staff from organizations including Union Schools, Tulsa

Health Department, Tulsa Public Schools, Oral Roberts University and Sodexo work together in the program.

"Most of the students and volunteer teachers come to class after a long day at work, but you see the hope in their eyes and the commitment in their hearts. It is a true testimony of reciprocal love," said Heidi Hernandez, coordinator of the Education Center. The mission is not only helping the students build the skills needed to have a better life, but sharing Christ's merciful love.

Many students are surprised when they find out their teachers are volunteers. What begins as "just a class" becomes a lesson about inclusion and fraternal love.

Our Education Center offers a Natural Family Planning program with the mission of promoting the culture of life, responsible sexual behavior, NFP and the Billings Ovulation Method[™] (BOM) among clients of Catholic Charities. To date, more than 158 participants have received instruction and guidance in these areas. The Education Center offers NFP classes in both English and Spanish, led by Margarita Summers, Heidi Hernandez and Lindsey Graham. 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Holiday Program Wrap-Up

Catholic Charities helps more than 50,000 people each year through its 12 programs, but the busiest time of year is when the weather gets cold and the holidays draw near. Here are some fun facts about the 2011 holiday programs:

Trav's Coats for Kids

With the help of Yale Cleaners and Channel 6, more than 14,000 coats were distributed through Catholic Charities and St. Mark's Parish in Pryor.

Thanksgiving Food Baskets

Catholic Charities distributed 400 Thanksgiving basket tickets and 500 Turkey only tickets. Due to the efforts of Bishop Kelley intern, Elliott Walz, the Turkey only ticket holders also received the "basket" or additional items. More than 750 baskets were picked up on the distribution day. More than1,300 turkeys were provided on the first day and in the days that followed, including 200 that were sent to Pryor. Food baskets were stocked by generous donations from St. Bernard of Clairvaux Parish, Holy Family Cathedral, TRC Restoration, Bishop Kelley High School, School of St. Mary and St. Catherine School.

Christmas Food Baskets

Catholic Charities distributed 1,000 Christmas basket tickets and 825 baskets were picked up on the distribution day. The remaining baskets were given out during the last four days before Christmas. St. Bernard of Clairvaux Parish provided turkeys for the baskets.

St. Nicholas Toys for Family Joy

Christmas toys were provided for 866 childrens during the week before Christmas. Toys were provided by Bishop Kelley High School, Cascia Hall Preparatory School, School of St. Mary, St. Pius X Church and School, St. Benedict Parish, Monte Cassino School, and Marquette Catholic School, as well as State Farm, Laredo Petroleum and Gallagher Bryce Insurance.
