Volunteers Planting Seeds of Hope in Our Community

Emergency Assistance (EA) is the Catholic Charities (CCEOK) program that provides clients with help for basic needs, connects them with available community resources and offers prayer for their needs – all with dignity and compassion.

Clients can request financial assistance through the program once a year, and those who request assistance are urged to enroll in case management – a strength-based service designed to encourage a partnership between a client and their case manager to tailor a goal-oriented plan to overcome financial stressors and prevent homelessness.

EA is looking for volunteers to assist with case management so that staff can concentrate on the other, longer-term components of managing client engagement.

There are no specific technical requirements for volunteers in this role, but volunteers need to be humble, patient, understanding, non-judgmental, and able to coach and mentor clients.

Training for this role would involve shadowing existing EA case workers, then followed by a stint at The Market

to see what questions clients are asking, and finally becoming familiar with the various programs both at Catholic Charities and those offered through other charities in the area.

Still in the "idea" stage are opportunities for volunteer-led ongoing workshops like a nutrition class or parenting classes.

EA is also working to place resource officers on campus. They are looking for volunteers to be present in The Market to assist clients with any other issues they might have and share information about other CCEOK programs, and resources available elsewhere in the community. EA is looking to staff these positions with (hopefully, but not required) bilingual people, and those special volunteers who can come in on Tuesday evenings!

CCEOK Welcomes Refugee Resettlement's New Volunteer Coordinator

The Refugee Resettlement program, which helps refugees originally from other countries adjust to their new lives here as our neighbors, has a new Volunteer Coordinator, Benazir Noorzad.

Originally from Afghanistan, Benazir is fluent in Dari, English, Hindi, and Urdu, and can converse in Pashto and Russian! She was honored as a Fulbright scholar at Oklahoma State University, where she earned a master's degree in Global Studies, and ever since joining the Refugee Resettlement team, Benazir has been taking part in all aspects of the CCEOK resettlement process.

Volunteers meet the families arriving from many different nations at the airport and transport them to their new living spaces – usually an apartment that's been rented and furnished in advance by the apartment set-up team. They are also provided a culturally appropriate meal. Refugees receive necessary legal assistance, are told about services available locally, helped with job searches and if they have children, they are enrolled in school.. In short, whatever help they might need in their first 90 days after arrival is provided through the program. The group also conducts a cultural orientation seminar to help these new neighbors adjust to life here in the US.

While there are some core volunteers who are assisting with helping our newest neighbors, more volunteers are needed to join the team!

There are no specific requirements for volunteers. What is required, though, is a general desire to help new arrivals become functioning members of our community. Some roles involve moving furniture into apartments, but other roles are not as physical. There is definitely something for everyone.


