Furniture Moving Team Delivers Hope

The Furniture Movers are another of the 'behind the scenes' ministries at CCEOK that helps individuals and families who need one or multiple household items to help get them back on their feet.

The team picks up very gently used, donated furniture and household goods, takes them to several storage locations, maintains an inventory of what is stored, and delivers items to clients in need at the request of various CCEOK programs. They are helping people rebuild their lives, one delivery at a time.

The team has its initial roots in the Afghan Resettlement Program, when many of them were either part of the team that delivered and set up furniture to the homes and apartments of our new Afghan neighbors, or helped in other capacities. The team became very close, and rightly so after working together to set up an impressive 65 homes and 98 apartments in a short amount of time between 2021-2022, and serving 801 Afghan refugees.

Once the Afghan resettlement project was finished, they moved their experience welcoming new neighbors over to CCEOK's Refugee Resettlement Program. When that program was closed due to government cuts to the national refugee process, the team wanted to continue serving those in crisis. They jumped in with the Disaster and Emergency Assistance programs to sometimes help deliver furniture, but mostly household goods. Those efforts have even blossomed into delivering for other programs as well.

The team's core members include Kathleen McGuire, Mark Marston, Sharon Washburn, Patty Hill, Chuck Merritt, Kathy Clarke, Tom Carson and Janice Wadsworth.

"The families we serve are so appreciative of the furniture and household goods they receive from this ministry," remarked Kathleen McGuire. "Their smiles, hugs and tears of joy are a huge reward to members of our team."
