CCEOK Volunteers are there in a snap!

When the recent issues regarding SNAP benefits impacted our communities, Catholic Charities experienced a significant jump in the number of people coming to The Market in need of groceries to feed themselves and their families. In response, we had many people step up to help us - including our wonderful volunteers who went above and beyond to serve our neighbors in need!

Instead of seeing 175 families in a day in The Market, Tulsa was serving sometimes up to almost 500 families per day, and the pounds of food we are able to give to those experiencing food insecurity grew from about 40,000 pounds per week to up to 120,000 pounds per week.

All CCEOK outreach locations experienced the same thing, showing an increase of 200% or higher due to the SNAP crisis.

The volunteer response to the crisis was nothing short of amazing! Some regular volunteers stayed longer; others took on new roles, and some even volunteered at additional times beyond their regular schedules. People who had never volunteered, and former volunteers, even came to Catholic Charities in our time of need!

"We have the very best volunteers in the world," said CCEOK Volunteer Director Kelly Cassidy. "Our volunteers are compassionate, they care about their neighbors who are struggling, and they don't hesitate to go above and beyond to help someone in need."


