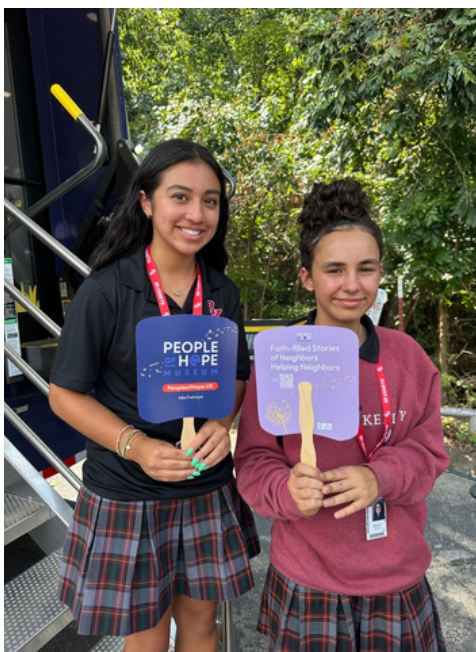
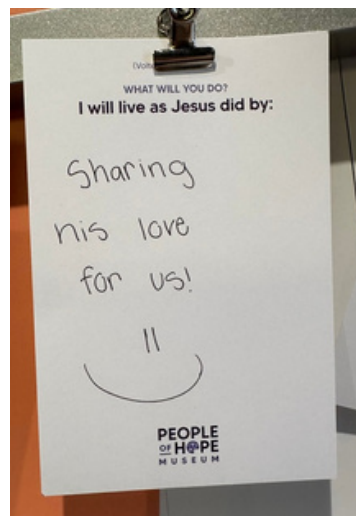
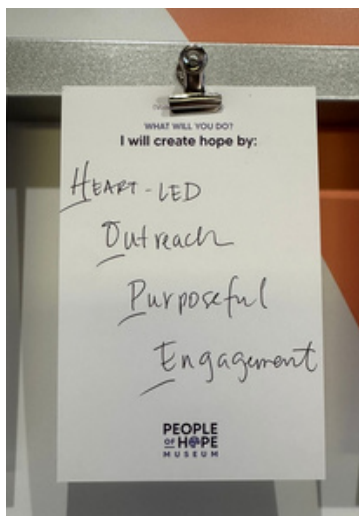

In Memory: Carol Lambert, CCEOK Garden volunteer

Carol Lambert dedicated her nearly 500 hours of volunteer service from 2023-2025 to cultivating fresh produce for the hungry in our community, as well as the beautification of the Tulsa campus, as a place of dignity and respite for those who come here for help.



"Carol was our 'weeder'," said Anita Mills, Garden Ministry manager. "She was always cheerful, she helped in other areas of the garden, but she always went back to weeding - which can be a quiet, meditative practice. I would arrive and see her hat someplace in the garden, where she had quietly begun searching for weeds when she arrived."

"When she announced in 2025 that she had been diagnosed with ALS, she warned us that she might not be able to continue much longer," Anita said. "She continued for a time with a walker, then could not come and weed any longer. The last time she visited, her husband brought her in a wheelchair, holding in her lap some plants for us. She is greatly missed."
